What to bring

- Medication must be handed in at registration day. Please name medication and provide dosage instructions
- Please do not send your children to camp, if they have had vomiting or diarrhoea 48 hrs prior to camp commencing.
- We are equipped to cook for the following allergies; Gluten free, Wheat free, Diary free, and vegetarian. All other dietary needs will have to be supplemented by the care giver of the child.
